Administrative DECISION/UPDATE | <p>Chairperson gave a brief explanation of the Deferred Agenda Items for October 6, 2022</p> <p>a) Approval ROC: 06/02/2022 – Approved: Joe Delaronde & Seconded: Jean Pommerville</p> <p>b) KLCC Executive Assistant 3rd Posting – Deadline today @ 4:00 pm</p> <p><i>ACTION: Leslie to consult with Human Resources and notify KLCC of the decision.</i></p> |
| 2. Legislative Updates | <p>a) Kahnawà:ke Residency Law (KRL) Regular Process→ Enacted via Urgent Process - <i>Leslie</i></p> <p>Regulations enacted July 18, 2022 (Regulation #8 & #9 for <i>the Compliance Officer and the Registrar</i>). These regulations will help move the Law forward through the Regular CDMP, with the Hearing Phase scheduled to begin in February 2023. The Regular CDMP will focus on specific areas of Law that require amendment and not a review of section, by section of the <u>entire law.</u></p> <p>b) Amendment to Kahnawà:ke Animal Control Law (KACL)– Leslie & Jean</p> <p>-Submitted Sept. 18, 2017. It is a Type II Law that would follow the Amendment Process (defined scope).</p> <p>-Although the initial request was to amend the Law, it is now logical to repeal and replace it given the numerous amendments made to the Law. Outstanding action from the Public Safety Unit is to get the Mandate from the Council of Chiefs and have them approve the Purpose and Scope (MPS) of the amendments to the KACL.</p> <p>-Public Safety’s Technical Drafting Committee (TDC) to contact Public Relations to refresh <u>the community on the proposed amendments to the KACL.</u></p> <p>c) Proposal for a Kahnawà:ke Occupational Safety and Health Law – Leslie & Jean</p> <p>-Unique with two submissions (May 23 & June 18, 2019) for <u>a KOSH Law</u> to give the KLO authority and enshrine its powers and responsibilities. This law will displace Quebec’s jurisdiction over occupational health and safety and replace the application of two provincial laws on the Territory:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Act respecting industrial accidents and occupational diseases</i> • <i>Act respecting occupational health and safety</i> <p>-There will be two laws created from this request.</p> <p>-The proposed law categorized as Type II, non-urgent.</p> <p>-Council signed an agreement with Quebec to replace the CSST (now CNESST) with MSI. This law must include certain clauses. If the community disagrees, CNESST would apply in Kahnawà:ke. This is a jurisdictional issue because it would mean that the CNESST inspectors would be authorized to inspect Mohawk constructions sites whereby their laws (noted above) would be applicable in Kahnawà:ke.</p> |

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| | <p>SUGGESTION: <i>KLCC to set mandatory front-end standards for the TDC to ensure they conduct ample consultation with the community.</i></p> <p>d) Proposal for a Kahnawà:ke Tobacco Law – Leslie & Jean</p> <p>-Next step→ bring revised proposed law to community for approval, followed by the Implementational/Operational plans w/legal review presented to CofC, Formal Reading of Law into the Record, Signing of Certification of Process & Enactment.</p> <p>-MOU categorized law as ‘Urgent’ →Write in the MCR (<i>not in the law</i>) that law must go back into the CDMP as Type II Regular Process on <i>certain date</i> (1 year after enactment). Regular Process to focus on specific scope or problem areas within the Law.</p> <p>In Abeyance: Kahnawà:ke Family Homes Law</p> <p>Waiting List: Amendment to MCK Election Law (<i>incomplete submission without Legislation Request Form</i>) & Kahnawà:ke Gaming Law</p> <p>Recent Submissions: Proposal for a Kahnawà:ke Right of Way Law (2.21.2022) & a Kahnawà:ke Legislative Act (5.4.2022) – (<i>incomplete submission without Legislation Request Form</i>)</p> |
