# 1. <u>2011/12 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA</u>

The LCC has eight submissions on its legislative agenda; as follows:

- 1. Membership Law: Request for Amendment Type I
- 2. Land Code: Request for Enactment Type I
- 3. Election Law: Request for Amendment Type I
- 4. KOSHA: Request for Enactment (tbd)
- 5. Justice Act: Request for Enactment Type I
- 6. Anti-tobacco Law: Request for Enactment Type I
- 7. Alcoholic Beverages Control Law: Request for Amendment Type II
- 8. Sanitary Conditions Law: Request for Amendment Type II

CDMP provides a limit of (6) six Type I Process Requests per MCK Term of Office. We are at that limit now.

#### TYPE I:

## **Anti-Tobacco Law**

- Technicians Jeffrey Diabo and Trina C. Diabo
- Information gathering & Communications Strategy development
- To be presented in two streams regulations and complete ban on tobacco.

## Judicial Act

- Community Representative had to step down because of employment with MCK. Alternative Representative stepped in for the remainder of the process.
- Technical Team has almost completed draft.
- This experience has shown LCC that process will be more effective if community reps participation begins at the first draft review rather than within the drafting process itself.
- Best case scenario for completion of this law:
  - First Draft is tentatively scheduled to go to the community in June 2011
  - Second Draft July 2011
  - Finalization August 2011
  - Enactment / Implementation Autumn 2011

## **Land Code/Act**

- Still in Preparation Phase. This is a huge piece of legislation. As such, it is slow moving. With the hiring of the new director, we foresee this process being reinitiated this spring/summer.
- Unit has to decide how they want to handle to move forward.

# **MCK Elections Law**

- OCC sponsoring unit. Technicians assigned: Lanny Jacobs & Jeffrey Diabo
- Need to settle Membership Law before Elections Law can move forward. Closely tied together (i.e. who's eligible to run for elections depends on band list).
- Project Plan Charter and Communication Strategy to be presented to LCC by end of March.

#### **Membership Law**

- Phase 1 CDMP not enough feedback to go to first community hearing. Decided conduct telephone survey with a possible blitz at Kahnawà:ke Services Complex afterwards.
- We will be provided an update once compilation of telephone survey complete.
- Survey Results will be publicized.
- Have update for next month's Strategic Discussion.

#### TYPE II:

# **Alcohol Beverages Control Law**

- Since 2009
- ABC Board of Directors submitted proposed amended changes
- Technician: Trina C. Diabo
- New Board of Directors LCC have to explain the CDMP to new BOD
- Probably have First Hearing by this summer

#### **Sanitary Conditions Law**

- On Legislative Calendar
- Technician: Heather Jacobs-Whyte
- LCC met and reviewed Type II process too lengthy need to streamline
- Will meet with Lands to explain process define between proponents responsibilities = content, and LCC's responsibilities = process
- External process to give to people LCC does internal process

# Kahnawà:ke Occupational Safety & Health Act (KOSHA)

- Type of legislation not determined. May be Type I since Council declared it to be a universal law
- LCC meeting MSI Unit on March 17th
- Issues with cost and enforceability
- Unsure of proponent could be SDU insurance, CPU health & safety, or OCC labor
- Labor issues regulatory to those units.

## 2. <u>LCC REVISIONS:</u>

#### A) CDMP REVISIONS

- Working on shortening Type I & II process
- Consolidating documents into QAWI
- Community Representatives Role

#### **B) LCC MANDATE REVISIONS**

• Currently being reviewed.

Once revisions complete, both documents will be brought back for Council's approval.

## A) ONKWARIWASHON:'A

Originated from Communications and used as vehicle for CDMP status updates. There will be four (4) editions per year.

#### **B) TELEVISION SHOW**

- Joe host and interview LCC members answering questions about CDMP
