<b>1. Previous ROC REVIEW/APPROVAL</b>	Approval of 6/2/2016 ROC - Approved
<b>2. FILE UPDATE REVIEW/DECISION</b>	<p><b>Tobacco Law – Jean</b>  -The working group met and gave Jean his drafting instructions. Once the few changes are inserted in the Draft Tobacco Law the following will take place:  1) 30-day posting of draft law  2) Legal Review done before Working Group goes to Council for Implementation/Financial, ... Plan  3) Schedule Final Reading of the law into the record  4) Schedule Council Meeting for enactment of the law  -Jean noted that Peggy Mayo asked him who drafts the Regulations. It was agreed that Jean would inform her that the instructions are stated in the law (section 7.1 b), that it would stand to reason it would be the KTA that would draft the regulations to be passed by Council.</p> <p><b>Rescinding/ Repealing Laws – Kevin</b>  -A Process needs to be developed to handle rescinding of laws.  <b><i>ACTION: It was decided to consult with Council at a Strategic Discussion session.</i></b></p>
<b>3. ENQUIRIES</b>	<p><b>Tiowérotón Policy becoming a Law - Leslie</b>  -Upon discussion about how to address the joint ownership with Kanehsatà:ke in Tiowérotón Law and using the CDMP, it was suggested that Council should be consulted before any decisions were made. Some possibilities discussed were to have a special joint Process that would allow Kanehsatà:ke to participate.  <b><i>ACTION: Leslie to inform Melanie Gilbert of KLCCs decision to discuss with Council before making any decisions how to handle using the CDMP.</i></b></p> <p><b>KFHL Validity – Kevin</b>  -The short answer is no, our law would not stand up in an outside court and the Bill S-2 prevails. However, we have to follow our process which includes putting our current KFHL through the 'regular' CDMP.  <b><i>ACTION: Leslie to send a letter to Chief Clinton Phillips &amp; Paul Nicholas asking them for the status of the KFHL and reminding them that the Process of putting the law through the regular Process should begin.</i></b></p>

<b>4. CDMP Procedural Manual</b>	-The CDMP Procedural Manual Working Group decided that Leslie & Kim would continue to revise the document then reconvene for approval before bringing it back to KLCC for final agreement.
<b>5. Other</b>	<p><b>Evaluation of CDMP - Leslie</b></p> <p>-Council wants to have an evaluation of the CDMP. A meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, August 11<sup>th</sup> (10:30 – 12:00 pm) to discuss.</p> <p>-Questions around the criteria to be used for the evaluation was discussed noting that if the decision for an evaluation stemmed from the length of time it's taken for the Kahnawà:ke Membership Law (KML) to be enacted that was not a good bench mark or indicator since the KML should not be rushed because it's fundamental.</p> <p>-Another point made was that there have not been any complaints received about any of the laws enacted through the CDMP whereas there were several complaints when Council used to pass laws.</p> <p><b><i>ACTION: Leslie to contact Winona to ask for the criteria to be used for the CDMP Evaluation by Council.</i></b></p> <p><b>Enactment of Justice Act &amp; Incidental (Consequential) Amendments that affect other Kahnawà:ke Communal Laws – Leslie</b></p> <p>-Concern about the incidental amendments to the Justice Act not being brought into force at same time as the Justice Act itself.</p> <p>-The administrative tribunal has to be developed because nine of the 34 laws that had incidental changes made after the enactment of the Kahnawà:ke Justice Act in July 2015, are going to be going through the CDMP within the next two years. These amended laws have to be reposted on the CDMP website.</p> <p>-Checks and balances have to be made for Boards and Commissions (i.e. Alcoholic Beverages Law &amp; Kahnawà:ke Gaming Law) who have the authority to make/amend their own Regulations without approval from Council or consultation using the CDMP.</p> <p><b><i>ACTIONS:</i></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b><i>1) Jean - Make changes with administrative references</i></b></li> <li><b><i>2) Leslie/KLCC - Bring back to Council for discussion/decision</i></b></li> <li><b><i>3) Leslie – Confirm through e-mail to Jean that nothing else has gone through Council (MCR) since July 2016.</i></b></li> </ol>
