<b>1. File Update REVIEW/DECISION</b>	<p>A) <b>KFHL</b>  <b>Discussion:</b>          A request was brought through Housekeeping at yesterday's Chief and Council meeting to overturn KLCC's decision not to extend the KFHL deadline of December 8, 2016. Noted at that meeting was that two KLCC Chiefs Advisory were not present, nor were the KFHL Portfolio Chief and Technician, when the decision was made by the KLCC. The request to overturn KLCC's decision was unanimously rejected by Chief and Council table.          It was noted that KLCC was not in a position to grant an extension because it was not part of the Process. Also noted was that KLCC followed its mandate which states that they only need five Commissioners present for quorum, which they had at the last KLCC meeting on December 6, 2016.          Chief and Council recommended that the KLCC Portfolio Chief, KLCC Coordinator, and the OCC Chief Political Advisor meet with the KFHL Portfolio Chief and Technician to ensure deadlines are appreciated and addressed in a timely manner. KLCC agreed with this recommendation and agreed to keep the Council table informed of all future activity including any correspondence relating to the KFHL. KLCC also agreed that the Urgent Law making process needed to be tightened up clearly defining the start and end dates, i.e. when does the process start and when does it end?          The KFHL will follow the newly revised Type I Process for new laws.  <b>Decision:</b>  <i>An immediate press release to be issued to inform the community that the KFHL would be holding a Community Stakeholders Consultation in the New Year as part of the Regular CDMP Information Dissemination Phase.</i></p> <p>B) <b>Residency Law</b>  <b>Discussion: Legal Categorization</b>          Reasons for the Type I Urgent classification of the Law were reviewed: Basic Human Rights can be affected if all "Non Member Residency" privileges are removed from the KML; as well the Descheneaux decision has impacted timelines invoking the urgency criteria. The deadline for compliance with this decision is</p>

	<p>February 2017.</p> <p><b>Decision:</b> KLCC supported the Type I Urgent categorization of the most recent request from Chief Rhonda Kirby. It will now go to Chief and Council for confirmation of the categorization.</p> <p><b>Discussion: Proponent</b> A meeting between all three people that submitted a request for a Residency Law needs to be scheduled to determine who would take the lead as the Proponent and to discuss their roles and responsibilities. KLCC now has three requests having the same categorization, one being Urgent.</p> <p><b>Decision:</b> Invite all three people to attend a meeting with members of KLCC to review the roles and responsibilities as Proponents of a Residency Law.</p>
